One of the more admirable initiatives recommended by NCC was that children should know where the language they speak and write originates. It follows, then, that the origins of literature should be similarly revealed. That's one reason why anthologies like this are so welcome. The book is divided into seven sections, each dealing with a specific area of Irish legend. It gives a sensible coherence to the reader untutored in this subject. The tales vary in length, providing the opportunity for a differentiated approach in classroom activities. The language used in the stories is quite difficult and this would be a collection for the more able reader. It provides a very useful addition to a classroom library as a work both for reference and for enjoyment.
